18D Rajasthan to Himalaya - 17 Nights / 18 Days

For those who have around three weeks holidays and want to cover most of North India - Its impossible. However, we have picked some of the iconic places to get you from the the capital city of Jaipur to the desert of Bikaner and Pushkar. Get to see the Taj and game drive for Tiger and Elephant sighting in Corbett. Divine tranquility in Haridwar and then some time in the mountains before you see the urban Punjab - Chandigarh

Day 1: Jaipur:

Today, you will start your trip from your hotel and drive to the pink city Jaipur. Arrive in Jaipur and transferred to hotel. The rest of the day is at your leisure. If time permits you may visit Birla Temple. Overnight in Hotel.

Day 2: Jaipur:

oday you have a guided tour in Jaipur includes a visit to the Amber Fort, Jal Mahal, Hawa Mahal, City Palace, and Jantar-Mantar (a scientific observatory).

The picturesque capital of Rajasthan, Jaipur is color-washed pink – the color of hospitality in

Rajput tradition. Built in 1772 by Maharaja Sawai Jai Singh II, Jaipur displays a remarkable harmony in architectural splendor. The only planned city of its time, a formidable wall encircles Jaipur. Overnight at hotel.

Day 3: Bikaner:

After having breakfast you will transfer to Sigiriya, after checking in to the hotel and afternoon you will visit Sigiriya rock fortress which is the world heritage site, according to chronicles which have been built by King Kashypa as his palace, this rock is nearly 200 m high and when you climb afternoon you can see beautiful sun set top of the rock. After coming down and resting at the hotel, overnight stay at Sigiriya.

Day 4: Pushkar:

After breakfast, you will drive to Pushkar (250 km) has a relaxed atmosphere and is an important city for pilgrims who come here to bathe in one of India's holy lakes. The afternoon is at your leisure, where we can recommend a walk around the lake. A small camel ride is also arranged.

Day 5: Agra:

Today after a long drive we reach Agra (270 km). Enroute we visit the ghost city Fatehpur Sikri. Time permitting; we'll go for a sunset view of the Taj Mahal. The evening is at your leisure.

Note:- The Taj Mahal is closed every Friday, the Muslim day of rest. If your trip dates make you arrive in Agra on a Thursday then it will be advisable to do the trip in reverse order OR visit Taj on Thursday evening as it will be closed on Friday. You will see the Taj sunset view. If you start reverse and arrive in Agra first.

Day 6: Moradabad:

Today you will start the day with the visit to beautiful Taj Mahal. After breakfast we visit the impressive Agra Fort (Red Fort) and drive to Moradabad (270 km). Moradabad was named after Murad, son of Shah Jahan (Mughal emperor who built the Taj Mahal). Moradabad is famous for its many shops and large exports of brass ornaments, artwork and statues to the whole world.

Day 7: Jim Corbett:

,After breakfast, you will drive to Moradabad to Corbett National Park located in the state of Uttaranchal in the foothills of Himalayas. The Ramganga River runs through the park's low mountains. Along the riverside are often crocodiles and freshwater turtles soaking in the sun. On

the grass plains, south of the park's headquarters you'll find abundant wildlife: Indian elephants, leopards, jackals, langur monkeys, wild boars and others. In addition, there are over 500 bird species, including hornbills and sea eagles. Overnight at Resort.

Day 8: Jim Corbett:

Today, you will spend entire day in the national park. You come on a jeep safari with a guide. If you are lucky, you can get a glimpse of one of the park's tigers. Overnight at Resort.

Note: If there is heavy rainfall, there is a risk that the Jeep Safari might be cancelled due to security reasons.

Day 9: Haridwar:

After breakfast, you will drive to Haridwar (150 km) -one of the seven sacred cities in India-lies at the foot of Shivalik mountains where the Ganges leaves the mountains and spreads into the north Indian plains. The Ganges and the holy "Vishnu footprint" make it an important pilgrimage site. No alcohol is available and you cannot bring your own. Only Hindu vegetarian food is available in town. Overnight at hotel.

Day 10: Shimla:

After breakfast, you will drive to Shimla (2,205m) is a pleasant city with a strong British influence and a pleasant climate in summer. The city center-Mall Road-is often closed to vehicle traffic, which creates a relaxed atmosphere. The streets are steep and narrow, and the many well-preserved houses from the English colonial times. We recommend a hike up to Jakhu temple (40 mins). Overnight at hotel.

Day 11: Shimla:

After breakfast, you will drive from Shimla to Manali (260 km), a well-developed mountain village in the Indian Himalayas (2,050m). The city is characterised by the fact that a large part of the city's residents come from neighbouring Tibet. From Manali you are likely to see snowy mountain peaks. Don't miss the charming old town and the Tibetan bazaar. Overnight at hotel.

Day 12: Manali:

Today you can look forward to a truly beautiful drive up to Rohtang Pass (3,979m).

At the mountain pass it is possible to go skiing, snowboarding, riding on yak, eat a light lunch or simply enjoy the amazing views of the Himalayan snow-capped mountain peaks. On the way back to Manali, we take a look at Solang Valley. There are opportunities for optional activities such as paragliding, four-wheel and off-road motorcycles, riding on horseback and shooting drills. (Any activities in the Solang Valley or Rohtang Pass are not included in price). Alternatively, you can choose to relax and enjoy the landscape. Overnight at hotel.

Note : If roads to Solang or any other places are closed by authorities due to heavy snow, 4x4 vehicles might need to be hired by the customer on a direct payment basis. A trip all the way up to Rohtang Pass is only available after winter when the snow gets clear from the road. The customer has to hire a local vehicle / pay direct for the trip to Rohtang.
