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Wonderful Week around Everest 07 Days - 6 Nights / 7 Days

Cities Covered: >> Lukla >> Namche Bazaar >> Tengboche >> Monjo >> Kathmandu-



On this trek you will realize why the Everest Base Camp Trek is one of the most celebrated hiking routes in all of Nepal. As you trek through the rocky ravines, beautiful forests, and steep mountain paths of the Khumbu region, you will lay your eyes upon the highest mountains in the world. You will be fully surrounded by the stunning Himalayan giants known as Lhotse, Nuptse, Pumori, and Ama Dablam—to name just a few. And if you're a nature lover, you will savor the opportunity to explore the mysterious Sagarmatha National Park on the way there, keeping your eyes feasted with rare flora and fauna.

Day 1: Lukla:

Flight to Lukla and Trek to Phakding [2656 m]

Today we start with early morning flight to Lukla by picturesque mountain flight to the magical land of Lukla. On this short thrilling flight, you will be enjoying stunning views of the Himalayas including Mt. Everest. As soon as we land at the Lukla airport, you will be surprisingly rewarded by the beautiful surrounding mountain where you will meet the local Sherpas and begin the trek to Phakding for today's 4 hours walk. Trek from Lukla towards Phakding is a normal and easy move following the Dudh Kosi River through pine and cedar woods to the first camp of Phakding.

Walk Hours: Approx. 3-4 hours

Meals included: Lunch and Dinner

Overnight: Tea House

Day 2: Namche Bazaar:

Trek to Namche Bazaar [3450 m]

At Namchee you can witness your first look at Everest itself. The trek from Phakding is beautiful where you will be crossing the Dudh Kosi River and head up the Khumbu valley following in the footsteps of the mountain porters loaded with supplies for hotels in Namche Bazaar, Tengboche, Dingboche, and Gorakshep. Pass by the trail from Phakding to the double bridges that has a level ground walk via Monjo and Jorsalle. From the end section of the suspension or Hillary bridge the walk starts to get a little tougher, with a steep ascent to Namche Bazaar through the blue pine forest. Reaching Namche bazaar, is another highlight of the day.

Walk Hours: Approx. 6-7 hours

Day 3: Namche Bazaar:

: Rest day in Namche Bazaar

Today is the day to acclimatize in the thin air. Explore the beautiful trade center in the Himalayas, this is the last point where you can get the last chance to rent any additional gear or equipment for the high altitudes. If you want to see nightlife then Namche Bazaar is still for you and it is the chance to enjoy it.

Meals included: Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner

Overnight: Tea House

Day 4: Tengboche:

Trek to Tengboche [3846 m]

The view from Namche to Tengboche is unbelievably beautiful, you will enjoy the close-up front mountain views of Thamserku, Kantega, Ama-Dablam, Kusungkangru, Phortse peak, as well Mount Everest, and Lhotse in distance. The distance from Namche Bazar to Tengboche is today which takes around 4-5 hours walking through rhododendron forests, mani walls, and Chorten (stupas) to reach Phunge Thanka where normally stop for a lunch. Later cross a suspension bridge and start climbs for another two hours to reach Tangboche, the trail after lunch is a relatively tougher. As you reach Tangbocche, you will be so much amazed with a stupendous surrounded mountains and the Monastery- the largest monastery in the Khumbu region, visit the monastery in the evening when daily ceremony is performed by monks.

Walk Hours: Approx. 4-5 hours

Meals included: Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner

Overnight: Tea House

Day 5: Monjo:

: Trek Tengboche to Monjo [2850 m]

As the Tengboche weather is unpredictable during the day, begin your trek early after breakfast. Take a descent to the Imjatse River, then a steep climb for about an hour will take you to Sanasa. Looking back at the village and Mt. Everest in the backdrop, you will move on through the rugged trail towards a lush green forest. You might have the chance of coming across musk deer, Himalayan Tahr, or even the rare red panda. Trekkers have often shared the experience of

witnessing Blood Pheasant and Impeyan Pheasant. The route then takes a steep descent to the Dudh Koshi River. Cross the river via a suspension bridge towards Jorsale.

It is the buffer zone of Sagarmatha National Park. You will further walk south towards Monjo Village. Monjo is a small village known best for being the checkpoint or the entrance gate of the national park.

Walk Hours: Approx. 6-7 hours

Meals included: Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner

Overnight: Tea House

Day 6: Monjo:

: Trek Monjo to Lukla [2800m]

After bidding adieu to the lovely locals we head on towards the Dudh Koshi River trail. There is a descent in the first part of the trek to Benkar. From there, you will take a suspension bridge and head to Ghat to stop for lunch. From here we continue the trek towards Phakding village. There is a gradual climb until we reach Chablung village. Walk past a thick forest of birch and juniper where you get to the Pasang Lhamu Memorial gate in a short while.

You will have reached Lukla village. Keep your belongings in your tea house, then head to the streets and enjoy yourself with the locals. The small village has a lot to give in terms of exploring. There are various shops in the area where you can find adorable souvenirs to take back home. The people here are friendly and welcoming.

Walk Hours: Approx. 4-5 hours

Meals included: Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner

Overnight: Tea House

Day 7: Kathmandu,:

: Flight to Kathmandu

In the morning take flight back to Kathmandu. As it takes over, you will see the snowy mountains getting faint at a distance. Back to the hilly paradise - Kathmandu! Upon arrival at the Kathmandu airport continue on your own with beautiful memories.

Meals included: Breakfast

The following cancellation policy is applicable and applicable fees is mentioned as a percentage of total booking price for Standard Tours booked directly on our website -

- 100% refund of the total booking price IF the cancellation request is received more than 30 days prior to the travel date / first day of service.
- 50% refund of the total booking price IF the cancellation request is received between 15 and 29 days prior to the travel date i.e. first day of service.

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Please note: Your guide will provide filtered water for you to drink which is preferable environmentally to buying mineral water since the bottles are not recycled. We recommend that you take two x 1-liter water bottles which can take boiling water (one is nice to have at your toes on a cold night, while the other cools down for the morning!)

Note: The local tea houses are basic but clean and they do not often have attached bathrooms or hot showers. The price is based on twin share and does not include any extra charge that lodge owners may levy for single rooms, attached bathrooms or hot showers (if these facilities are available) or for battery charging. We can't know in advance what they may charge for such things in the different lodges along the way, so we prefer to leave this cost out, rather than pass along an estimated charge to you.

The meal inclusions on the trek are breakfast (one set breakfast and tea or coffee), lunch (one main meal and tea or coffee) and dinner (soup, main and dessert with tea or coffee).
